10. As a candidate, what are your top three policy issues? (100 words or less)

Implement the strategic plan "Olathe 2040: Future Ready" of which my top three priorities are:

1) Exceptional Services

To provide high quality services efficiently. We must continue to improve our services and to be responsive to the needs of our citizens.

(2) Infrastructure

To provide a smart, connected, integrated, innovative infrastructure that is safe, reliable, efficient, and sustainable.

(3) Economic

To remain an economic leader in the region our strong economic base should be built by attracting and fostering highly successful businesses of all sizes, entrepreneurs, a skilled workforce, a vibrant downtown, and other attractive places throughout the community.

11. What are your views on the services and value the City's citizens receive for their local tax dollars? (100 words or less)

My views align with citizen views...Olatheans cherish the quality of services provided by Olathe. In a recent citizen satisfaction survey (DirectionFinder) the "Satisfaction with the "Overall Quality of City Services" in Olathe rated 94 percent; 25 percent above the Kansas City metropolitan average, and 46 percent above the U.S. average." Our citizens want us to provide quality services in the most efficient manner possible, without sacrificing the quality. Also from DirectionFinder: "Satisfaction with "Value Received for City Tax Dollars" in Olathe rated 73 percent, 20 percent above the Kansas City metropolitan average, and double the U.S. average of 37 percent."

12. What changes, if any, would you like to see to the City budget? (100 words or less)

I am grateful for the transparency in the budgeting process that has been the tradition in Olathe. I would like to see the City Budget lined up with our strategic plan Olathe 2040: Future Ready, so that the public can see how the budget dollars are being invested to accomplish their vision for the future. I would expect Olathe to continue to use data-driven best practices in the management of Olathe. Olathe is governed under strong financial management, with strong financial policies and practices. We should continue strong budgetary flexibility with a slight operating surplus in the general fund.

Cities play an important role in economic development. The policies, culture, and practices of a city form the framework for competing for business, workers and residents. Olathe must strategically foster an environment that nurtures and protects our existing local businesses and draws in new businesses to our great community. To succeed, we must be a place where people want to live! A robust economic development plan, and the right team in place to implement the plan, is vital for Olathe.

Managing a growing city like Olathe

in ways that support and drive economic growth while safeguarding resources and maintaining our competitiveness requires intentional management of growth and redevelopment. Targeted public-sector investment may be required to attract business to Olathe. Olathe should forge connections between businesses, investors,

and talent by by holding regular conversations with industry leaders and citizens. We need to foster a culture of growth in Olathe with the City embracing development that takes into account regional growth and cooperation of surrounding municipalities and regional service providers. We must be flexible.
